

Incident Details	Warnings / Lessons Learned
Mariner reported shortness of breath and chest pains; crew was isolated, and GWU MMA was consulted; although not a likely candidate for COVID-19, crew was taken to local hospital for assessment and battery of tests. Crew tested negative for both SARS-CoV-2 virus and COVID- 19 antibodies; all other medical tests were in normal range. Doctor recommended home rest.	
Mariner complained of abdominal pain. The ship was diverted to San Diego where the mariner was removed for the next level of care. They had kidney stones and has since fully recovered.	
Mariner was diagnosed with pneumonia. They were treated and sent home and has now fully recovered. Not COVID-19 related.	
Mariner slipped during line handling operations dockside and sustained laceration requiring four sutures.	
During grinding and sanding Mariner wiped their eye before cleaning their hands and introduced metal filing to the eye.
