- **-122** Cases in 2023
- 103 (84%) Resolved on Vessel; 19 (16%) Unplanned Departure from Vessel
- **-**27 (22%) Science Party, 95 (78%) Crew
- 26 (21%) Due to Injury
- 56 (46%) Due to Infection

- December 18, 2023: CDC Removes COVID-19 Guidance for Non-Passenger Carrying Vessels
