The movement of fuel and other volatile material as well as extremely valuable scientific devices inside and outside of the atoll demanded a high degree of attention on the part of the officer in charge because of the numerous coral heads and shallow waters. This was a hand on operation and as such I was never a paper mate. As captain on the LCM's I was required to transport the Marshallese employees to and from their homes on other islands

I followed specified grid patterns while observers conducted studies on the local whale populations. I was required to maneuver the vessel on quick commands in order to track the whales found and to record descriptions I also have worked on the Kahana for the Fish and Game department to supply the North Western Hawaiian Islands research stations with needed equipment and personnel. This involved not only my normal mates duty while in transit but also the launching of small boats from the Kahana and transferring men and gear ashore through coral reefs and surf.
