I used subcontractors in Spokane. I did most of the work myself, sometimes working very long hours with very little sleep.

I have been mostly selfemployed or under contract since I was 9 and have had several job experiences along the way. At 8 I was working on a construction with my step dad. At 9, I was working for people I did not know, cleaning swimming pools, washing cars, trimming hedges, cleaning fish tanks, raking leaves, pulling weeds, and doing general yard work/clean up tasks for people in my neighborhood. At 11, I started mowing lawns with my friends from my boy scout troop (Troop 131). At 13, I got a job at a restaurant called Taco Viva. My best friend worked there. He was also 13. We sometimes ran that place alone, during the day on weekends. At 14, I got a job at a place called International Bicycles. I assembled bicycles in a back room and got payed by the bicycle. I eventually did sales and repair. I was mechanically inclined. At 15, I got another job at a Schwinn dealer. They respected me as an expert bicycle mechanic. In the summer, I got night work cleaning a night club with 5 other people(3am to 9am), I also did food prep/cooking there a couple days a week (Josephs), and then I would go to work at the bicycle shop at 10am and work til 4pm. At 15, one of the bicycle shops I worked at was next to a windsurfing shop called Windsurfing Madness. They had a small area in their store dedicated to skateboards. The owner created a job for me selling skateboards and doing general retail work, stocking the store with soft and hard goods. Eventually I became a vital part of their team, as a department manager, buyer, retail sales associate, cashier, changing the front window display/store displays every month, and eventually expanding the skateboard department into a 200 square foot area(within the store) that was competitive with other surf/ skate shops in the area(BC surf and sport). I worked there for 4 and a half years. During ages 15 to 19 1/2, I also did repair and maintenance work on my mothers apartment building. I was doing plant husbandry, lawn care, in ground irrigation/sprinkler maintenance, painting, carpet care, window repair, changing locks, landscaping design, tree work, and some plumbing. At 19, I moved to Seattle by myself to try to become a professional snowboarder. I worked at McDonalds, Round Table Pizza, and in a warehouse(at Boeing). Then I worked for Howard Bowker Inc. assembling hundreds of office systems(cubical) on the Boeing plants in Renton and Kent. I also worked in their warehouses in Renton and Kent, alone and at night driving forklift, cleaning up messes, and doing inventory work. I then got a contract with a fishing boat company in Dutch Harbor, AK for K Fisheries. I did a full season, came back to Seattle on their boat, painted the boat that summer, took their boat back to Dutch Harbor, and my contract ended. I quickly got work that night with a shipping company called Sun Mar Shipping. I was loading and unloading pallets of bagged fish and driving a forklift.At 20 years old, I got another fishing boat contract with the F/V American eagle as a cook/junior deckhand. I saved 12 thousand dollars in 3 months. I went back to Seattle and bought a record store. I moved to Oregon and lived at the base of Mt. Hood. I worked at the Timberline Lodge at the Mt. Hood Ski Resort as a concierge/porter. I also had a summer job as a construction worker. I learned how to chop the roof off of a house and add a third story. We did foundations, driveways, decks and fences, painting, siding, window installations, skylights, roofing, framing, footings, cement pond/ water feature building, and door installations. I did this for two summers and then started doing side jobs on my own. At 21, I ran ads for handyman work. I ended up making much more money with my

side work than I did working for the construction company. I got a full share/deckhand contract on a crab catcher boat in Dutch Harbor called the North American. It was a third generation Norwegian fishing family owned boat that was a very healthy work environment. I was there for two seasons. I have worked on at least 5 fishing boats. My commercial fishing experience was seasonal 1989-1993 and one 6 month season in 1997. I sold the record store and had summers off. I did handyman work as well as construction/ landscaping design work on my own and hired help when I needed help on larger jobs. I built sheds, garages, decks, foundations, driveways, staircases, and foundations. I worked directly with homeowners and some contractors. At 22, I started a project making snowboard bindings. I advertised in Transworld Snowboarding magazine. I tested my products for two years and had an am team rider who is now a well known pro snowboarder at Stevens Pass and currently has a lifetime ski pass there(awarded to him (for free) by Stevens Pass). My company name was ROBO Bindings Company. I sold everything I owned to start the company in 1992. At 23, I got a contract with (Herb Obrien)H.O Sports/Hyper lite Wakeboards to help them develop their snowboarding program that eventually got called "Jobe Snowboards". I was developing their products in their factory(with the owner) in Redmond, WA 5+ days a week. I was paid in cash. It was like working in a high tech toy factory. The positive experiences I had there were endless. I worked with them for 3 months and did some field testing for another year. They did not like that I was selling my own snowboarding products under my own company name. I also got into auto repair more deeply. I started with air cooled Volkswagens(in 91) and moved on to doing Subarus exclusively. Subaru buyers are easy to work with. I would fix up 3 or four Subarus(to sell) every year. I had a little Subaru junk yard in my yard. I also sold used Subaru parts and did engine/transmission installations, and a few repairs for people I did not know. I had one employee for the Subaru/car repair/sales project. There was a "Subaru only" parts yard near by(West Seattle) that made it easy to get parts to do Subaru mechanical work. My handyman sidework turned into a steady job doing remodels and maintenance work for Solid Construction Inc. There is more to my story...
