Things that worked well ...

- Testing of van labs prior to sailing.

 - mapservers.



- Internet access.
- Livability issues (food, berthing, etc.)
- Medical screening procedures.
- The Native Observers.

Action Items I

NEW – from 2010 *HEALY* **debriefs**

- Clarify procedures for tracking and storage of hazmats.
- 2 Clarify role of the MSO prior to and during cruise.
- 3 Address need for winch on *Healy*, either through provision via a winch pool or (preferable) by providing it as permanent deck gear.
- 4 Addition of On-Ice Operations as a line item on the cruise debrief form.

Action Items II

Active

- 1 Modifications/clarifications of cruise planning form on IceFloe.
- ② Ongoing issues with acquisition of ice imagery.
- ③ Clarify accountability, details, and obligations for Alaskan Native Observers program and post the information on IceFloe.
- 4 Returning *Polar Sea* to full science capabilities.
- 5 Stress that budgets allow for inclusion of science upgrades to the *Polar Star*.
- 6 Clarification of interactions among foreign vessel ops, DOS, and Alaskan Native Communities.
- ⑦ Coordination among Alaskan Native groups (e.g. AEWC), chief scientists, and D17.
- 8 Science equipment MOA: NSF and USCG.
- Istablish service and maintenance contract for -80 freezers.
- MSF to establish science logistics support to cover issues e.g. review of radioisotope use.
