- Only operational Arctic icebreaker in U.S. inventory
- Returned from 254-day Arctic summer & winter science deployment
 - NASA ICESCAPE
 - Extended Continental Shelf Exploration (w/ CCGS LOUIS S. ST-LAURENT
 - North Slope Mooring Deployment and Recovery (Pickart)
 - Winter Arctic Transect (Ashjian)
 - Nome Tanker Escort
- 2012 Arctic cruise schedule complete







POLAR SEA and POLAR STAR

POLAR STAR

- Expected to return to service in late 2013.
- Caretaker status from 2006 to 2011
- 2009-2010 appropriation provided \$62.8M to reactivate and extend service life to approximately 2022.

- CG intent to decommission awaiting determination of final disposition.
- Crew and funding transferred to POLAR STAR.
- Usable equipment and parts being transferred to POLAR STAR

• POLAR STAR is undergoing an extensive overhaul intended to lengthen its useable service life to approximately 2022 and is expected to be back in service in FY 2013.



A new icebreaker???


- FY13 President's Budget: \$8M
- In 2013, the Coast Guard will develop operational requirements to acquire an icebreaker that will serve
 - its missions in the Polar regions
 - support missions that have been traditionally conducted with other Federal partners
- We will work closely with the Administration and those Federal partners to ensure we acquire the right capability.
