DESSC Recommendations and Suggestions

Over the past year, during meetings and phone conferences, the following recommendations were made by DESSC members. The status and any required follow-on actions will be discussed.

Imaging Copyright and Attribution:

- Request that WHOI/Chris finalize the draft policy on attribution based on the DESSC meeting discussions (recognition for Chief Sci/inst)
- WHOI should keep Chief Scientists informed about who is using their images that are in archive and how their images are being used.
- WHOI should add a brief statement at the top of the copyright policy that explains the purpose and application of the copyright (images cannot be sold, WHOI holds the copyright, and the copyright basically applies to commercial use of the images).

Sentry Follow-Up:

- In accordance with the Criteria for adding assets to NDSF, WHOI provided a report on Sentry's first year of operations in Nov 2011. DESSC review is required.
- Request that WHOI update the Sentry website and better disseminate this information. The pages should include personnel contacts.

HD Camera Specifications – WHOI should alert the science users that the resolution of the Still Images from the HD Video cameras is 2 Megapixels. If higher resolution is needed, use the Still camera.

Optimizing the use of Technologies (Imaging, sonar, etc.) – It has been recommended that WHOI post a list of personnel on their website who are experts on particular topics and could be collaborators/hired to assist scientists with particular tasks during their expeditions.
