













Summary of Agency Recommendations for 2013 Fleet Operations

- In CY 2012, NSF approved transfer of *R/V Oceanus* to OSU and retirement of *R/V Wecoma*
- NSF plans to retire *R/V Cape Hatteras* in 2013 & *R/V Point Sur* will be considered in 2014
- ONR plans to retire *R/V Knorr & R/V Melville* to prepare for crew training prior to deliveries of AGORs 27 and 28. *Knorr* to be retired in April 2014 & *Melville* to be retired in December 2014
- ONR has initiated scoping studies for mid-life refit of Global AGOR 23 class to include *R/V Thompson*, *R/V Revelle*, and *R/V Atlantis*.
- NSF and ONR recommend the operators of all ships find ways to reduce costs and seek appropriate opportunities to support research and education programs by other funding sources, including institutional funds

R/V Sikuliaq - Global Class Acquisition (NSF)

- Operator University of Alaska
- Begin Science Operations CY 2014

Ocean Class Acquisition (Navy)

- Operator Selections made in May 2010 -AGOR27 to WHOI and AGOR28 to SIO
- Ship deliveries in 2014/2015

Regional Class Research Vessel (RCRV)

• NSF awarded RFP for the construction of up to three Regional Class ships to OSU. The first ship would enter the Fleet in roughly 2019.




Heightened Security for UNOLS Ship Schedules

- The UNOLS Website will now publically post "secure" schedules for the Navy-owned ships- *Atlantis, Knorr, Revelle, Melville, Thompson, Kilo Moana*
- A full, detail schedule is available for internal use and scheduled PIs. UNOLS can authorize permissions.
- "Secure" ship schedule includes:
 - Year
 - Ship
 - Version & Date
 - Scheduler & Contact Information
 - Month, PI, PI Contact Info, Name of Project
 - Grant #, Days, Agency/Program/Funding



UNOLS Goals and Priorities – 2012 & 2013


