
Quick Refresher: MSR and UNCLOS

1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea

- Article 238: right to conduct MSR
- Article 245: coastal state jurisdiction over MSR conducted within territorial seas
- •Article 246: coastal state jurisdiction over MSR conducted within EEZ
- •Article 250: <u>communications concerning MSR</u> <u>projects shall be made through appropriate</u> official channels

Incoming: MSR in waters subject to U.S. Jurisdiction


- Presidential Proclamations 5030 and 5928, and Presidential Statement on U.S. Oceans Policy (March 10, 1983).
- Advance consent of the United States is required for MSR conducted within the U.S. territorial sea, but generally is not required for MSR conducted within the U.S. exclusive economic zone...

Incoming: When Advance Consent Required

(based on U.S. domestic law)

- MSR in the U.S. EEZ that:
 - is within a *national marine sanctuary*, a marine national monument, or other protected area
 - involves study of marine mammals/endangered species
 - involves commercial quantities of marine resources
 - involves ocean dumping research
 - MSR that involves contact with the U.S. continental shelf.
 - ECS?

Incoming: U.S. Interagency Review Process
























Outgoing: U.S. Scientists in Foreign Waters

Process to Request MSR Consent for U.S. citizens in Foreign Waters




U.S. Embassy Engagement

- Obtain MSR consent
- Help update OES public website of coastal state MSR requirements
- Opportunities for public diplomacy: sharing science through outreach
- Confirming sovereign immune status for USG research vessels (new process); HTSOS
- New Embassy Officers every 2 years
- Some locally employed staff
- Some process multiple (Suva, Hague, Paris, London, etc.)

MSR Challenges and Recent Trends

Challenges and Trends


- No system/Unfamiliarity, Complicated systems
 - Recent trend: increasing bureaucracy, evolving requirements, firm 6 month timeline from when coastal state receives
- Timeliness
 - Mexico: Firm 6 months, into RATS 7 months advance
- Optics
 - Ex: IODP, sail drones, etc.
- Changes to application
 - French territories: easiest, notify local authorities
 - Greece: new consideration, 1 month
 - Mexico: minimum 15 business days


Challenges and Trends, Cont.

- Changing processes
 - Bermuda: new form
 - France: French translation, 6 months
 - Canada: 3 months, data, sea ice from aircraft MSR
 - Denmark/Greenland: new forms, buffer 1 week
 - Mexico: go to Embassy website for now

 - Costa Rica
 - Cuba: MINREX form, 6 months, Spanish Form A

- Mexico






Challenges and Trends, Cont.

- Extreme events: hurricanes
- Late Reports
 - Need preliminary AND final
 - Platform operator has to submit in RATS
 - Coastal States increasingly asking: Mexico, Costa Rica
- Maritime Claims/Disputes
 - South China Sea
 - China, Taiwan
- Not MSR?
 - Argo floats (still include in some cases and if deploying in EEZ), military survey, port calls, equipment testing


Maritime Boundaries
