Briefly Discuss Priorities for Group

- 1. Review and evaluate Federal infrastructure plans regarding facilities (e.g., ships, submersibles, ROVs, AUVs, and maritime research aircrafts such as UAVs) necessary for the conduct of ocean research and observation
- 2. Facilitate coordination across Federal agencies on policies, procedures, and plans related to major Federal oceanographic assets
- 3. Evaluate future needs and coordinate plans for future investments in ocean-related facilities
- 4. Ensure plans for modernization of the Federal oceanographic fleet and its role are included in the broader national observing network

Top 3 Deliverables for Group

1. Establish an annual presence of the IWG-FI at the MTS/IEEE OCEANS Conferences to provide a forum for the Federal government to communicate the status, needs, and challenges of the Federal Oceanographic Fleet.

- a. The 2018 MTS/IEEE OCEANS conference will include at least three IWG-FI sponsored events: 1) a town hall panel discussion; 2) a live-streaming science-at-sea ship telepresence event; 3) technical track presentations [October 22-25, 2018]
- 2. Develop an Addendum report on Fleet metrics which updates the status of the *Federal Fleet Performance Measures Report* [Spring- 2019]
- 3. Develop an Action Plan for a collaborative project which combines three existing Federal agency programs to support Early Career Scientist training by using ship transits to take undergraduates to sea. [Summer-2019]

Envisioned Collaboration Effort

- 1. The IWG-FI maintains coordination with the Interagency Ocean Observations Committee (IOOC)) through its dual Co-Chair representation. The collaborative workshop on Glider best practices and the IOOC Ocean Observations Metrics Task Team will benefit IWG-FI and IWG-SUS.
- 2. The IWG-FI is actively engaged with the USGCRP Observations Working Group through cross-working membership and collaborates with the NOPP.
- 3. The IWG-FI collaborates extensively on numerous Federal Oceanographic Fleet issues with the University-National Oceanographic Laboratory System (UNOLS) Council and Subcommittees and leverages ship construction, management and operations Lessons Learned and Best Practices through the International Research Ship Operators Group.
