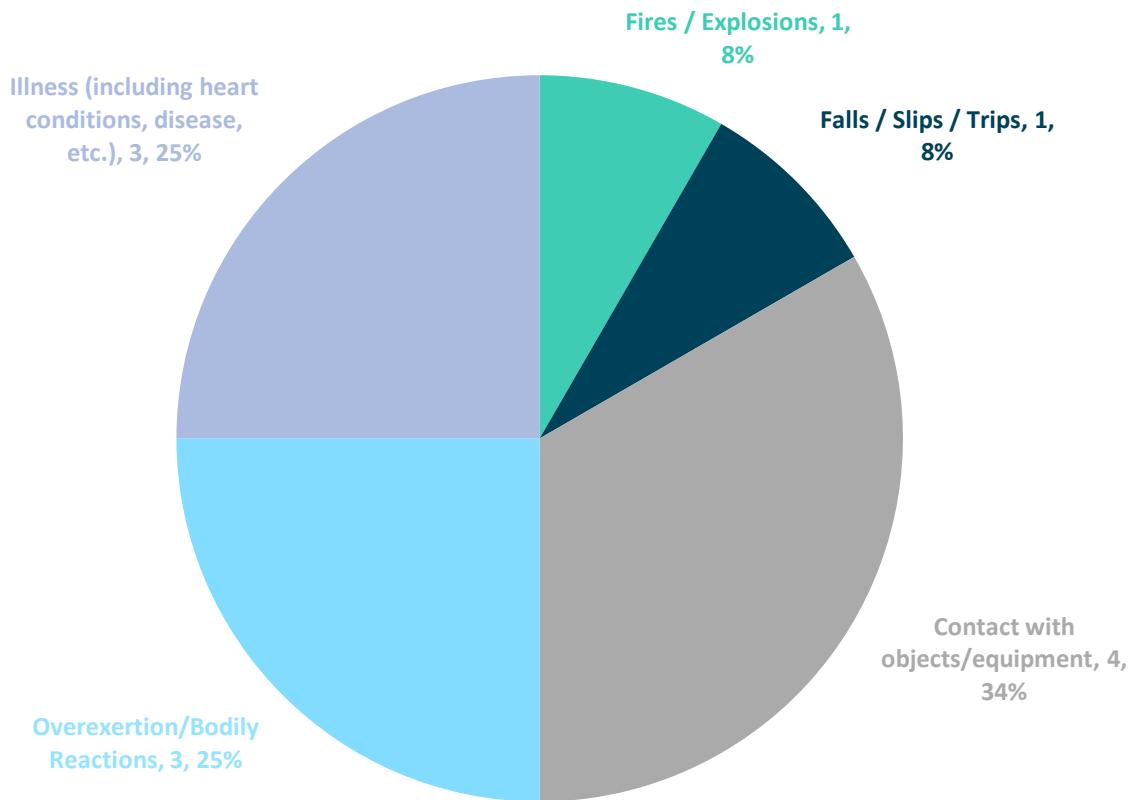


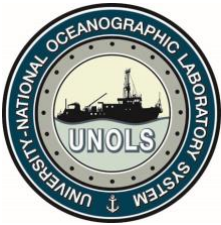

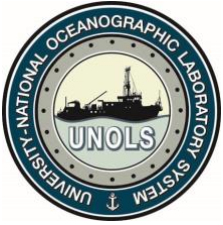

Crew member received a minor injury as a result of losing their balance.	
Scientist received a minor injury as a result of losing their balance.	
Crew member working on a piece of equipment had a wrench slip off the nut and knock their front tooth out.	
Crew member had sore/swollen knee after spending a length of time kneeling while working in engine room.	
Crew member slipped on deck and hyper-extended knee.	
Marine technician had finger pinched while connecting two pieces of equipment when hand slipped. Cut to finger was stitched and bandaged and tech returned to work.	
Science party member reported and was treated for an upset stomach.	
Science party member reported and was treated for cold symptoms.

Crew member strained shoulder lifting forward hatch.
