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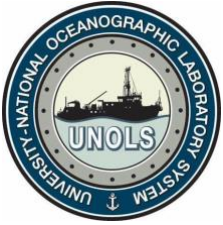
Crewmember reported unidentified pain- pressure in abdomen. GWMMA consulted - no diagnosis. Crewmember to be seen ashore.	
Ear infection - Crewmember reported experiencing pain believed to be due to swimmer's ear. George Washington Medical assistance advised to treat with drops for effected ear.	
UTI - George Washington Medical advised medication.	
Two people onboard with UTIs.	
One person with an infected molar.	Stress the importance of dental care.
One person with an infected gum.	
One person had an allergic reaction requiring an epi pen.	Make sure people list allergies correctly for pre-cruise forms.
One person crushed their finger.	
During a heavy following sea (Sea State 7 to 9), the back deck was completely awash and sometimes overrun with green water. During that time a plastic SOPEP container (4' x 3' x 3') and a very heavy wooden workbench broke free from the deck, were displaced by large waves and proceeded to float freely around deck. Two crewmembers went out on deck and attempted to secure the loose items before they did more damage to other equipment and hydraulics in the near vicinity. In the process of doing so, another large wave unexpectedly washed over the port side and immediately swept both crewmembers off their feet and carried them forcibly into a nearby winch. The crew members held onto the winch as the water receded but, they were visibly shaken and very sore. Moderate (Grade 2) contusions subsequently developed on their thighs and lower legs.	
One person slipped and hurt a finger during the fall.	Ensure that slippery areas are addressed with non-slip tape and paint. Slippery areas to be kept clean.
One person tripped over equipment on deck.	Keep working areas clear of obstructions.
One person hit themselves with a spanner while trying to open a valve.	
There was a brief fire as an injector came loose out of the engine, creating a hole in the valve cover of the cylinder	



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head. The fuel spray immediately ignited. Engine was stopped and fire extinguished within minutes.	
A crewmember experienced an acute onset of severe back pain and vomiting while the vessel was underway. After receiving onboard treatment including Ketorolac and Hydrocodone, the individual was transported to a shoreside ER in Guam upon the scheduled arrival, where a CT scan confirmed a kidney stone. The crewmember remained ashore for medical follow-up to pass the stone safely before traveling home, with plans to rejoin the vessel for the next scheduled assignment.	
Crewmember reported abscess in mouth. Seen by dentist - foreign body removed.	
Crewmember reported pain in chest. Sent ashore to hospital for evaluation. Severe Indigestion diagnosed and crewmember returned to vessel. The next day the crewmember reported similar chest pain and returned to hospital for evaluation. Hospital admitted crewmember to allow for elevated level of care. Crewmember was discharged from the ship.	
Crewmember had an eye vessel rupture. Eye drops provided from local urgent care.	
Crewmember suffering from colitis.	
Crewmember arrived to work with swollen left elbow and minor pain. No known incident or cause for pain. Sent to urgent care.	
Crewmember out with cold/virus.	
Crewmember with gout flare up.

Crewmember cut his left middle finger with a knife while installing the water maker. Cut was cleaned and bandaged.

One person with chest pains in port, went to emergency room. No cause found after tests.	
One person had a persistent case of flu like symptoms and had to be seen ashore by a doctor.	Wash your hands. Hand sanitizer around food buffets. Don't come to your work area sick to avoid infecting others. Wear a mask if unsure.
A crewmember sustained a shoulder injury due to overexertion while performing maintenance on the vessel in port. The individual was working in a confined, non-ergonomic space under a stateroom sink and exerted forceful pressure on a wrench to loosen a seized, corroded fitting. The incident required first aid but did not result in lost workdays.
