




- It has the longest fault line ever recorded (1,300 km)
- It was the largest quake since the 1960 Chile quake (magnitude 9.5)
- It was relatively shallow (only 10 miles beneath seafloor)
- The northern rupture zone was in open water, exposing beaches in Thailand






