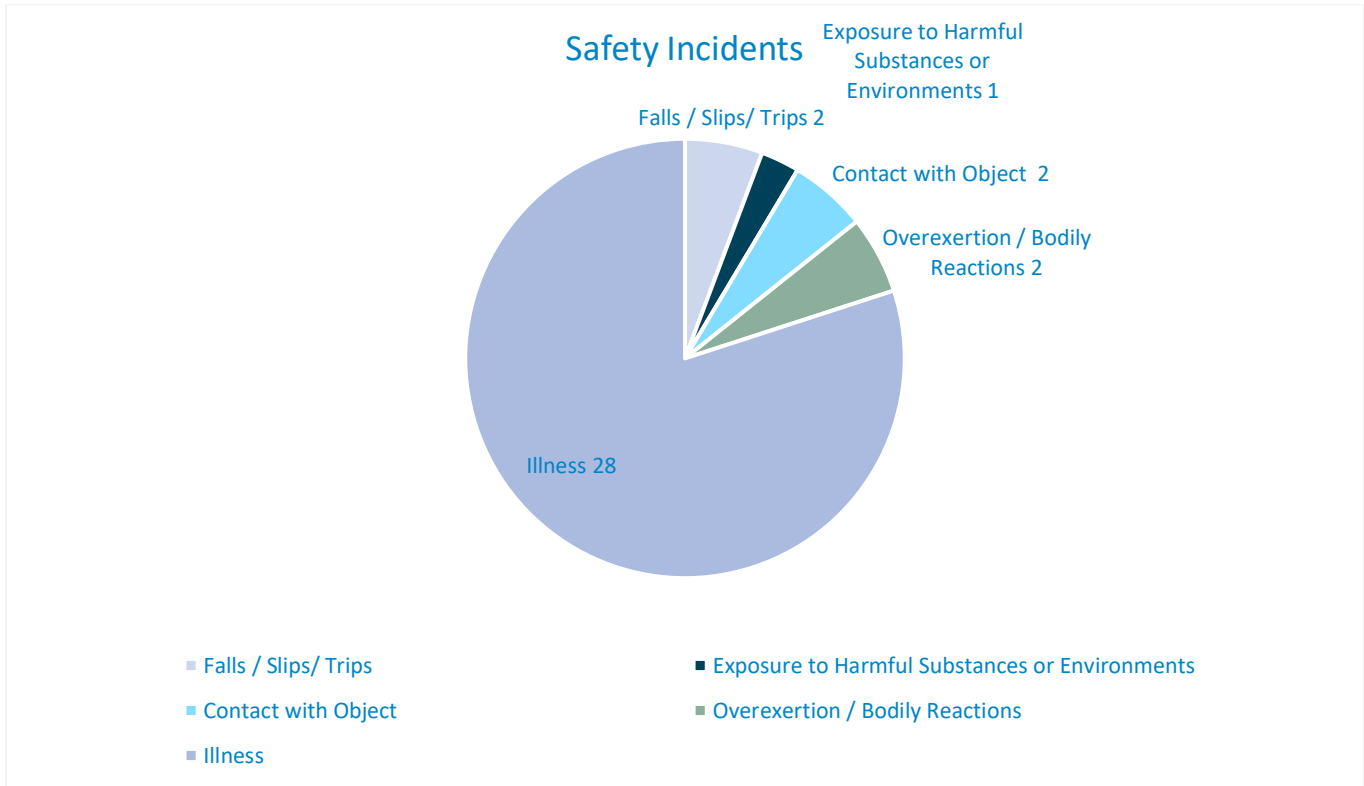
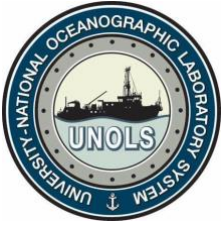

Incident Details	Warnings / Lesson Learned
Mariner had a cold/flu	
Crewmember had an ear infection	
Crewmember sprained ankle walking downstairs	
Crewmember injured knee while working with tag lines on the vessel, became a P&I case	Encourage proper handling of line.
Mariner got blisters on their feet	Make sure that crew's safety wear fits properly.
Crewmember complained of frequent urination. Contacted GW and took blood sugar. Advised to avoid fruit juice and monitor blood sugar. Crewmember later complained about fatigue and GW recommended he see clinic before departing for home after scheduled relief. Case closed with GW	
One crew member with particle in eye. No specific work-related cause.	
Four Covid Cases in port among crew	
One respiratory infection	
One crew member pulled muscle due to overexertion	Encourage crew to wear braces if they have previous injuries.
Five crew contracted COVID resulting in cruise cancellation	
Crewmember got a bug bite in port and needed to be treated with antibiotics	Encourage crew to report any injuries or illnesses promptly.
Three Covid cases while in port. No one had symptoms. Crew followed covid protocols.	Covid testing protocols work to prevent spread.
One inhalation of drain cleaner vapors	
Five COVID cases in port	Ongoing COVID precautions
