



<p>Illness: Severe case of sinusitis, GW Maritime contacted, meds prescribed.</p> <p>Exposure to harmful substances: scientist sustained minor chemical burn; GW Maritime contacted validating procedures taken.</p> <p>Fall: scientist slipped when stepping from Zodiac</p>	<p>N/A</p>
<p>Crew member became ill with pneumonia</p>	<p>N/A</p>
<p>1/ An AB suffered injury to index finger when attempting to lift a heavy vent cover to reinstall in place. Gloves were being used but were insufficient to prevent the injury. It was determined that the vent was too heavy to attempt the lift at sea, without assistance.</p> <p>2/ While cutting food for meal preparation in the galley, a Cook suffered laceration on a small finger when the knife slipped. It was determined that slowing down and taking more deliberate action when cutting could have prevented the injury.</p> <p>Neither case resulted in lost time.</p>	<p>Noted in incident details</p>



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
